Principal's Report - Bob Bender

- Happy new year
- Weather:
 - It's starting to get cold outside; please make sure kids are bundled up and that their gear is labeled (e.g., hats, scarves, gloves). The kids go outside every day for recess unless the weather is too severe.
 - We are preparing for a possible snow day next week, which means a remote learning day. Teachers will send out any links needed to sign in. We will be offering specialty classes throughout the day, which will be voluntary. Attendance will be taken on remote learning days, so please log in for 8:30 am morning meeting. We have planned fun things for kids to do on snow days.
- The kids will have a new schedule beginning the last week of January. Some grades will have new specialty classes.
- Report cards come out at the end of the month.
- Reminder: Students are allowed to bring cell phones to school, but they are not allowed to have them on them during class; they must be in their backpacks. Smart watches are allowed but must be on school mode.
- Spirit Day on January 19 will be "Crazy Day" the Student Council made sure to make it accessible for everyone, at no extra money or cost. Come to school with mismatched clothes, crazy hair, etc.
- Wednesday, January 17 is the 5th grade Rosie's Theater performance at 9 am. We will try letting
 parents into the cafeteria beforehand.
- 3rd graders started Circle in the Square they are working with published playwrights to write their own scripts, and their plays will be performed on Broadway.
- 1st grade started chess program once a week.
- We recently sent out information on the new ELA curriculum: our teachers are getting trained in the new mandatory ELA curriculum. It is a 3-day training, so there will be 3 days in a row where kids will have substitutes in the classroom. The training is starting with Kindergarten teachers. Please send your kids to school teachers will have lessons planned and attendance will be taken.
- This is the first year our 5th graders will be taking state exams on the computer. The DOE is transitioning year by year to computer-based testing. This applies to just 5th graders; they will be taking Math, ELA, and Science tests. 3rd and 4th graders are taking paper-based tests.
