Principal's Report - Bob Bender

- Pajama Day thanks to our Student Council for planning these Spirit Days
- Gratitude for Math Night on May 9th, will repeat it in the Fall
 - Recording will be shared
- State tests:
 - o This was the first year 5th graders took the state exams online
 - Next year grades 3-5 will take the state exams online
- Preparations have begun for next school year
 - Teachers and staff are heavily engaged in planning for next year
- Programs that would not happen for children if not for parent volunteers:

 Garden, Chickens, Book Fair, Auction, Gala, Yearbook, Participatory Budget Work, Moving On Ceremony
- Received the final plan for the new playground, shared with the Student Council who was influential in the design of the playground and they love it
- PS11 Potluck event a tradition for 15 years
 - Friday, June 21 there will be a DJ, dancing; everyone brings a dish, brings their own drinks; please bring what you can
 - Children must be supervised: everyone under the age of 18 must be accompanied by an adult
 - If children need to use the restroom, they must be accompanied by an adult
 - This is a community event, so please bring friends and neighbors



Financial concerns

- Decline in enrollment means less DOE funding
- We will have fewer classes next year
- The funding raised by the PTA ensures we can provide for students in ways that aren't within the means of the school budget

- Safety
 - We have heard about an increase in incidents around the school. Please call 911. The more people who
 call, the better case we create for more police support for our school
 - For trash complaints please call 311; there is also an app
 - If you see something, please say something. It is most important to first call 911 or 311; we are happy to hear your feedback once you have reported incidents and complaints to 911 or 311
- The PTA covers the cost of the all School Supplies, Chess, Math, Phonics, and Science curriculum, and all of our shows. We may have to limit programming, e.g., Theater, Music, Art, school trips, Circle in the Square, Ballroom Dance, and puberty lessons. Extra staff overseeing recess is also paid for by the PTA. None of these programs and resources are part of our school budget all of it comes from the PTA budget. However, the recent lower rate of donations means we may need to give up some programs for the next school year

Budget / Finance Report - Joshua Hollander & Kunal Prakash (ps11treasurerchelsea@gmail.com)

- Majority of this past month's revenue is from Gala ticket sales and the Book Fair
- A good amount of last month's fundraising came from Bender Bar pre-sales
- Expense recognition is mostly due to the 5th grade show and the school website
- We are at 65% of target for our fundraising goals, but this is an overstatement because of upcoming expenses that have yet to be factored in. Our runway is getting very short with the school year coming to an end soon
- We are in danger of our programs being cut next year if we don't raise enough money. This funding keeps our school special and equitable for all kids who attend. Please donate: <u>Annual Fund (givingfuel.com)</u>

- The bulk of the budget is from individual donations and corporate matching. The Gala's silent auction is all profit
- PS11 only charges for two events during the year. We don't charge for our shows or for field trips aside from a
 nominal fee for t-shirts. We don't charge for event attendance. We only charge for Comedy Night and Gala, our
 two biggest fundraisers of the year. We want to make sure admission is as equitable, broad, and wide as possible

- Fundraising events vs annual fund donations: We focus on annual fund donations the entire year from the first PTA meeting until the last day you walk out the door. We have a yearbook donation page, we send home backpack flyers, and send out the weekly digest and emails every week. We talk about annual fund donations so frequently that we've received feedback from families that they're being asked all the time to donate to the annual fund. We try to balance that out with events that bring the community together and give more opportunities to provide donations through auctions, prizes, raffles, etc. Interest in giving is varied, but we work to keep the expenses as low as possible

- We have been using our budget surplus from our covid years (when we spent less on programs) to pay down the budget deficits we've had for the past few years, but that surplus is nearly gone
- We know it's not easy to attend PTA meetings many thanks to the Communications committee for summarizing meetings; but we know that messages/word of mouth is even more effective, so please spread the word
